Leadership UMC (LUMC) begins its 15th consecutive year of successful training and development of emerging laity leaders. We had 51 graduates in the 2015-16 Class in April 2016. We celebrate that LUMC has over 500 graduates, many of which have now assumed major leadership roles in the local church, district, annual conference and beyond. Some graduates are delegates to the 2016 General and Jurisdictional Conferences. During our annual conference, we invite the graduates to participate in the LUMC Chorus and the Conference Board of Laity morning devotions are given by LUMC graduates. Our goal is to continue the tradition of encouraging LUMC graduates toward exemplary servant leadership. LUMC is recognized throughout the country as a premier program ~ second to none ~ for equipping laity to serve in partnership with clergy for mission and ministry within the community and around the globe. LUMC is unique in its design to offer Methodist laity an experience that mentors graduates for a life-long journey “in the connection.”

The 2016-2017 series will feature our same curriculum with the four weekend workshops designed to equip the emerging leader. All workshops are facilitated by our professional staff. The dates are:

These four workshop topics and curriculum have proven to be essential building blocks for lay leadership and creating vital congregations. Each session we receive critique regarding effectiveness from lay and clergy attendees. We focus on making improvements. The research for the small group reports is done *outside the workshop times* and is centered on the 16 Key Drivers of Vital Congregations to assist local churches in “making disciples”. We also partner with NGA Conference Connectional Ministries to schedule the LUMC participants to be a part of the Mystery Guest Visitation program to gain insight in the area of hospitality to enhance the welcoming atmosphere in our churches. All workshops are held at Simpsonwood UMC. Lodging is provided at a nearby Marriott hotel property in the Norcross area. All expenses including materials, four nights lodging, meals, and snack breaks are included in the tuition for participants. All expenses for the participant’s pastor to attend the March 10-11, 2017 session are included also. Tuition fees for the complete series:

**Participant Tuition = \$100 double occupancy room accommodation (one queen bed and one hide-away sofa bed),
OR \$260 for Single room accommodation**

Local Church Tuition = \$175;

District Tuition = \$175.

Persons with a desire to “join the leadership team” and possess the gifts and graces to fulfill a role of leadership in the local church are prime candidates for LUMC. Applicants must be recommended by 1) the local church lay leader and pastor; 2) commit to attending all of the four workshop sessions; 3) complete and submit the application to the district lay leader at the district office prior to the advertised deadline (earlier if possible). The blank application found on the reverse is on the Conference Board of Laity page of the NGA Conference web site: www.ngumc.org and is distributed by the districts. The District Board of Laity reviews applications and selects four applicants to recommend to the LUMC Board each year. The Conference Board of Laity and the LUMC Board of Directors are the final approving authority for each application and participant. It is important that the applicant understand that in order to receive the LUMC graduation diploma, individual certification, as well as the LUMC pin, one must be an active participant in all four sessions which begin on Fridays at 5:30 p.m. until Saturday at 5 p.m. Each workshop builds on the knowledge and information acquired in the prior session to provide a strong foundation of leadership. *Equally important is that each participant is randomly assigned to a small group that works together through technology on a research project outside of the workshop times and the group’s report is presented before the class at the last session with each participant required to take an active part in the preparation, research, as well as the oral and written report.* It is an honor to be selected to represent your local church and district at LUMC and we strive to make our laity development curriculum an exceptional experience.
