These four workshop topics and curriculum have proven to be essential building blocks for lay leadership and addressing skills for vital congregations. Each participant is assigned to a small group that researches subjects related to church vitality. All workshops are held at <u>Oak Grove United Methodist Church</u>. Lodging is provided at a nearby hotel property in the area. All expenses including workshop materials, four nights lodging, meals, and snack breaks are included in the tuition for participants. The participant's pastor attends the March session at no additional cost. Tuition for the 4-session series:

Participant Tuition = \$100 DOUBLE occupancy room accommodation

or

\$320 for SINGLE room accommodation:

Local Church Tuition = \$175; District Tuition = \$175.

Applicants must be recommended by 1) the local church lay leader and pastor; 2) <u>commit to attending all of the four workshop sessions</u>; 3) complete and submit the application to the district lay leader at the district office prior to the advertised deadline (earlier if possible). See application on the reverse or on the Conference Board of Laity page of the NGA Conference web site: <u>www.ngumc.org</u>. The District Board of Laity reviews applications and selects four applicants to recommend to the LUMC Board each year. The Conference Board of Laity and the LUMC Board of Directors are the final approving authority for each application and participant. It is important that the applicant understand that in order to receive the LUMC graduation diploma, individual certification, as well as the LUMC pin, one must be an active participant in all four sessions which begin on Fridays at 5:30 p.m. until Saturday at 5 p.m. Each workshop builds on the knowledge and information acquired in the prior session to provide a strong foundation of leadership. Equally important is that each participant is randomly assigned to a small group that works together through technology on a research project <u>outside</u> of the workshop times with a report presented before the class at the last session. Additionally, each participant is expected to participate in the Mystery Worship Visit to enhance local church hospitality for visitors.

It is an honor to be selected to represent your local church and district at LUMC and we strive to make our laity development curriculum an exceptional experience.
