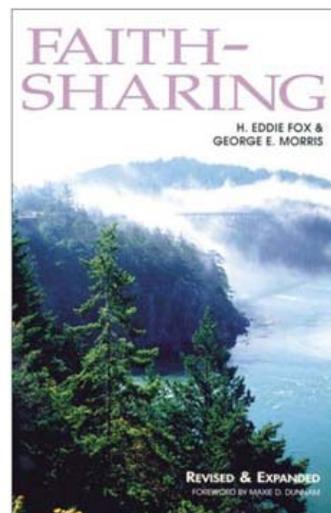

Listening is Key to Sharing Faith

I believe that the Good News of God's love shown through Jesus Christ is the most significant fact of human experience. Salvation by faith is an essential and foundational Christian principle. But how do we communicate that truth on a personal level?

"Witnessing for Christ" or "sharing your testimony" is a frightening challenge for many persons who are fully committed disciples of Christ. Images of abuse and instances of harassment enter the minds of many persons as they hear others speak about evangelism.

Dr. Eddie Fox and Dr. George Morris offer a balance of theory and practice for this task in their book, *Faith Sharing: Dynamic Christian Witness by Invitation*. In the foreword to that book, Dr. Maxie Dunnam says, "We must share the faith, not for the sake of the church, but for the sake of the persons with whom we share." The authors provide guidelines for anyone to be "engaged in evangelism as naturally and normally as a robin sings or a happy child plays."



Among other things, Fox and Morris suggest that a relationship of trust is necessary for effective sharing of one's faith. They believe that a Christian "witness" requires honest, perceptive, non-judgmental, relational listening which conveys trust and acceptance to others. Listening opens the door for speaking.

Dietrich Bonhoeffer believed that listening was a form of Christian ministry. He said, "The first service that one owes to others consists in listening to them. Many people are looking for an ear that will listen. They do not find it among Christians, because these Christians are talking when they should be listening."

One professor has concluded that there are six rules for good listening:

1. Compassion: "Suffering with" or "to be with."
2. Concentration: Focusing attention entirely on the other.
3. Control: Discipline that knows when to speak and when to remain silent.
4. Comprehension: Similar to discernment, or the ability to know where the other is coming from.
5. Clarification: Helping others clarify their thinking and feeling.
6. Commitment: Willingness to stick in the relationship and do whatever love demands.

There are not many people who are good listeners by nature. However we all can learn to listen and in doing so we might earn the right to speak so that others would listen. Or maybe we just need for others to know that we care enough to listen to them.
