Church Development Grants Available

The Griffin District Trustees, Finance Committee, Board of Church Location & Building, and the District Leadership Team have recently approved the creation of District Church Development Grants that will be available to assist churches with a variety of property related issues. The grants will be funded through proceeds from the sale of closed churches in the district, and will be available to vital and active churches that are current with apportionments and District Work Fund, have at least 1 outreach ministry, and have some funds on hand or pledged for the project. Projects could include parking lot paving, making the facility more handicap accessible, major upgrades or repairs to the facility, etc. Grants will not exceed \$5000, except in rare cases.
